

Charter School Funding vs. ISDs



WESTLAKE ACADEMY RECEIVES \$8,775 FROM THE STATE OF TEXAS

This \$8,775 represents just 45% of the Academy's total cost to educate each of our IB learners. For 2023-24, providing an IB education at WA costs \$19,658 per student.

As a charter school, WA does not receive revenue from property tax. Property taxes stay with each student's zoned-for "home ISD".



ISDS FUNDED 100% BY STATE OF TEXAS AND LOCAL PROPERTY TAXES

Traditional ISDs, unlike charter schools,
receive an average of 35% of their revenue from
the State of Texas and 65% from local property
taxes. For 2023-24, ISDs will receive 100% of
their funding - an estimated \$13,290 - from
State and local sources to educate their students.

WA Families

Town of Westlake Funding the Town of Westlake - For 2023-24, the Town of Westlake contributes approx. \$6,932 per student toward the overall cost of a WA education. The Town pays the WA building debt,

the WA building debt maintenance/repairs, and "central office" services supporting every student (e.g.,HR, IT, Finance).

State Funding

BLACKSMITH ANNUAL FUND

FY23 Final Stats

- Provided \$1,200,056 (109% goal) to the Academy to support '22-23 school operations.
- Donor families gave an average of \$1,950/student. When spread out to cover all 865 students, gift average = \$1,443/student.
- **71% parents** (375/527) donated for their 640 students.
- 57% new families (40/70) contributed to BAF.
- As reminder, funding gap = \$2,685/student; requested donation of \$2,500/student or family's best gift
- **476 gifts** received from parents, grandparents, faculty/staff, alumni, corporations and foundations

FY24 Campaign To-Date

- Thanks to **375** generous donors, we were the #1 school for third straight year with **\$1,051,565** raised on Blacksmith Giving Day.
- As of 10/3, gifts & pledges = **\$1,106,800**
- Current averages: donor families = \$1,991/student; spread out to support all 880 students = \$1,258/student.
- 63% families (337/536) have donated for their 556 students.
- **55.6% new families** (45/81) have given so far.
- Grade Captains initiating Phase 2 Operation Finish Line!


































COMMITTEE WORK

Development Committee



• Crafting proposed fund levels, fund types, pledge payment terms, gift agreements, etc.

Investment Committee

- Exploring various WAF resources that could serve as sustainable funding source for the annual **Gift Cards for Classroom** initiative.
- The Instructional Leadership Team (ILT) will be providing several options with varying cost totals to assist discussion and need.
- In the meantime, WAF used \$10,862 in carryover gift card-designated donations to provide **\$100** "welcome back" gift cards to 110 faculty, staff and leadership members (\$20,194 remaining)
- The ILT confirmed they would like to continue the Gift Card initiative as part of their efforts to retain and appreciate faculty and staff.

Gala Committee

- Working theme = **Platinum Gala** to celebrate 20th Anniversary
- Working to confirm spring date & venue
- Considering scaling back silent auction to include only student art and WA teacher experiences
- New idea = dept. projects as auction packages that guests can directly donate to (e.g., library, theatre, science, athletics, fine arts)

GRANTMAKING AND MGMT.

Monthly Discretionary Grants

• Sept. 28 – Approved **\$12,831** for **"Biology & ESS Equipment"** to provide materials for hands-on lab investigations for over 200 G9, 11 and 12 students.

Donor-Designated Funds

- Connecting with staff to advise available funds and process for utilizing seven (7) restricted funds totaling \$52,390.
- These funds are designated to support: dyslexia tutoring, student travel awards, drumline, performing arts, athletics, club activities, and the Sawyer Davidson PYP Science Lab.

External Grants

- Working with teachers and admin to facilitate usage of **Hudson Foundation** grants spanning 2 years with **\$203,000** remaining.
- Hudson "mini-grants" include funds for teacher orientation, backto-school activities, K-G12 class experiences, prof. development, Jr-Sr Prom, Cheer Team, and 20th Anniversary events
- ILT will advise project to best utilize **\$25,000** grant from Bryce Trust at **JPMorgan Chase.**
- Original request = \$146K for PYP classroom furniture, laser projector in MPH and cabinets for common spaces.
